

Where does the time go? It only seems 5 minutes since we were writing last year's newsletter. Again, it has been a torrid time with the major conflicts still ongoing around the World, namely Ukraine and the Middle East, that are influencing the UK in many ways. Regardless of this our thoughts are with the people and families who are both affected in these war-torn areas and have families here in the UK.

Regarding the UK, the NHS is still facing pressures on all fronts with a continuation of the lengthy unprecedented waits for health care. Although the main effect has been on access to our secondary care facilities, it is also a major issue for primary care. This is not helped with the continuation of the various COVID strains and the current viral / influenza issues meaning additional winter pressures on all health systems.

Locally we have also been affected, not only by the above, but also by a continued increase in patient numbers registered at the surgery. In 2009 numbers were 6707, but this has increased to 8545 by November 2024. This increase brings tremendous pressures, and frustrations, on the medical team, staff and patients, resulting in longer appointment times and staff working longer hours, (often exceeding the designated number of patients they should see each day). This is not helped by being unable to expand the building, and facilities, so that additional clinical rooms and staff could be brought in. Of course, we are not the only surgery with this problem. This scenario hence enhances the importance of having the strong working relationship between the surgery and Patient Forum that we have built up over the years. As we mentioned last year, systems for contacting your GP changed dramatically during the pandemic. These have become the norm with the introduction of telephone triaging, receiving GP call backs, video appointments to name just a few. For some people the new methods are better but not for everybody. However, these ways are here to stay so we now see the role of the Patient Forum to work with the practice of ensuring two-way communication and patient involvement being built upon.

During 2024 the triage appointment system was introduced. This was after full consultation with the Patient Forum subcommittee and involvement of the full Forum. Trials were carried out, and the system introduced in June. Naturally any change can bring its own problems but by this close involvement, good communication, and taking on board comments and suggested modifications from patients, the system is still in place. All agree it's not the absolute answer, but we could not continue with the old appointment system. It will be constantly looked at by the surgery and Forum with modifications made as necessary.

In terms of the Forum itself, it has been a very busy year and below is a summary:

- Founder member and Chair, Jayne Gormley, stood down in April 2024 and thanks were given for her support over her many years of involvement and service.

- The sub-committee met on several occasions to discuss,
 - the effect of increasing patient numbers.

- the verbal abuse that was being aimed at staff at the surgery. This resulted in the publication of a document informing patients that the Patient Forum supported the Practice in condemning this behaviour and any action taken against patients who carry out this abuse.

- questions for the patient survey.

- the total triage system.

- introduction of the hearing loop system at reception. This project was a joint funded venture between the surgery and the Patient Forum and is a great example of the two sides coming together to improve a service to our patients. This will be built on throughout 2025 with other opportunities being explored and initiated where possible.

- In June the Forum forged stronger links with Tutbury Parish Council, and representatives now regularly attend the meetings. This has helped strengthen the standing of the Forum within the local community, as well as working together on joint enterprises.
- The Forum website has been kept updated.

Activities throughout 2024

• Health and Wellbeing Event/Carers Event

The event was held on the 1^{3th} of June within the Village Hall. As with previous years the event was a great success with over 26 organisations taking part with a good flow of people from the community attending. The feedback from the exhibitors was positive and all wish to attend in 2025. There was also the opportunity for patients of the Tutbury Practice to discuss with ZD, Assistant Practice Manager, the new triage system.

• Patient Survey

Throughout June a patient survey was conducted. This was at the same time as the new total triage system was introduced so that initial reactions could be obtained. The survey was completed by 229 patients. The full analysis and report can be found on both the Practice and Patient websites with a hard copy located within the waiting room at the health centre.

• Prostate Cancer Talk

The talk took place on Thursday 12th of September between 6.30pm and 8pm. This was one of our objectives for 2024. The Burton Prostate Support Group gave the talk and presentation.

It was well supported, 20 patients plus Dr Mike Salwey, and Philip Hope, Practice Manager. Those who attended were extremely grateful and the talk promoted informative discussion. In addition, Dr.MS stressed the importance of being examined as it is a cancer that can be dealt with if caught in its early stages. If any patient had any doubts or concerns, he stressed they contact the surgery and make an appointment to see him. It is important to point out that although it appears there are a good number of clinical staff some of these only carry out a certain number of sessions. This is because the surgery is a teaching Practice, so some time is spent training medical students. In addition, the Phlebotomist only works mornings and the nurses job share. In addition, Arwen has two days at university.

The surgery also has the Midlands Partnership University Foundation Trust renting rooms, via NHS Property Services, who own the building to offer Physiotherapy, Talking Therapies, Baby Clinics and Podiatry Services

1. Wider Communication

On July 1st, 2022, all Clinical Commissioning Groups, CCGs, were disbanded and the Integrated Care Boards, ICBs, were introduced. In Staffordshire there is only one ICB for Staffordshire and one for Stoke on Trent. These replaced all the previous 5 CCGs. They also took the decision to remove ALL Patient and District Boards and Groups.

However, the East Staffordshire District Group was independent from the CCGs and so has continued to meet. During 2024 the meetings, every six weeks, have been face-to-face. The objective of the group is to enable patient representatives, from each of the PPGs within the East Staffordshire area, to come together and discuss areas of good practice and those of concern. The aim is that meaningful discussion can be held across the whole spectrum of East Staffordshire GP surgeries. This expectantly will lead to the provision of consistent high quality medical care and services for all patients within East Staffordshire. The Forum has a representative who attends these meetings, and the current Chair and Vice- Chair are also people who sit on the Tutbury Patient Forum.

With the abolition of the Patient Board, it is difficult to have a link directly with the Integrated Care Board and raise issues. To try and negate this the Chair and Vice-Chair of the District Group, who are also members of the Tutbury Practice Patient Forum:

- attend the Staffordshire wide Integrated Care Board Patient Assembly,
- have contact with the East Staffordshire Primary Care Network,
- attend the University Hospitals of Derby and Burton (UHDB), NHS Foundation Trust Patient Group meetings,
- Sit on various workstreams run by the Midlands Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust
- Were recently elected to sit as the voluntary sector representatives on three of the seven portfolios that operate under the Integrated Care Board.

In addition, the current Forum Secretary, John Bridges is the Chair of the East Staffordshire and Surrounds Diabetes UK Patient Network. The network covers all East Staffordshire, Lichfield, Tamworth and Burntwood

The network is a local support group for people living with diabetes, their families, partners, carers, or anybody with an interest in diabetes.

During 2024 the network has continue to hold face-to-face meetings at:

- Tamworth

And in addition, run a virtual Zoom meeting every six weeks which attracts people from other areas of England.
